Welcome to the final wrap-up of the New Inherit project, a two-year European journey of transformation, collaboration, and creative revival. **Together with 8 partners across 6 countries, we engaged over 900 people** directly through our mobilities, testbed activations and multiplier events, uniting around a powerful mission: **to breathe new life into cultural spaces across Europe**. By focusing on cultural heritage, sustainable tourism, and the creation of new skills in the circular economy, the project has fostered innovation and deep community engagement. Through co-creation and entrepreneurship, we've worked to sustainably revitalize six heritage buildings “**Agora Cultural Labs**” from the 18th to the 20th centuries, located in Brussels, Weimar, Omodos, Sofia, Palermo, and Murcia. This is the story of how historic spaces are being reimaged as vibrant hubs of cultural and social life.

Highlights of NEW INHERIT

● January 2024 - Project Launch

The NEW INHERIT project was officially launched, aiming to revitalize cultural spaces in Spain, Belgium, Germany, Italy, Bulgaria, and Cyprus.

● February 2024 - Kick off Meeting

The Kick off Meeting took place hosted by the Project Coordinator, CGE e.V Erfurt, in Weimar, Germany where all the partners met for the first time and laid the groundwork for the project

● November 2024 - 1st Study Visit in Germany

The training was a great experience for all participants and fostered a deep sense of collaboration, creativity, and empowerment among them. The combination of interactive sessions, study visits, and hands-on activities equipped participants with practical tools for project planning and made them discover new methodologies, for engaging communities and turning ideas into action.

April 2025 - Study visit in Murcia, Spain

From the 7th to the 11th of April 2025, representatives from partner organisations along with 5 Cultural Ambassadors from each country, travelled to and met in Murcia, Spain for the Creative Europe project: INNOVATION 4 HERITAGE – Creating NEW talent through adaptive reuse of Heritage and Co-creation of Cultural space activation. During these days, the Study Visit was held and the representatives of the partner organisations participated in a Transnational Partners Meeting (TPM) to discuss updates about the project.

The mission was to present examples and promote adaptive reuse of heritage sites to enhance the creative and cultural sectors, create jobs, and sustain culture and innovation. We emphasize co-creation, entrepreneurial mindset, and new approaches to curriculum building in Cultural Heritage adaptive reuse, supported by community consultation.


October 2025 - Study visits in Brussels Exploring Adaptive Reuse and Creative Spaces

The group set out on an Adaptive Reuse City Expedition, uncovering how Brussels' urban fabric integrates history and innovation.

One of the first stops was the House of Compassion, located in the heart of the city. Participants learned how the site reuses sacred architecture as a contemporary space for social justice and inclusion.

Then, the delegation visited Capital vzw, a cultural venue dedicated to supporting young artists, musicians, and creators. The site visit offered a close look at how a former industrial space has been repurposed into a creative hub where community and culture thrive side by side.

Finally, participants to MANIAK Padoue, another inspiring example of adaptive reuse. Once an industrial site, it now serves as a multidisciplinary art space where creativity, collaboration, and craftsmanship intersect.




